HOW DOES EDUCATION LOOK FOR THE DEVELOPING WORLD?

- In Canada, education is considered a basic right. However, in the developing
- world, there are nearly 58 million primary school-aged children not enrolled in
- school.
- 53% of these children are girls.
- These children are at greater risk for exploitation, child marriages, and lower-
- income earning potential.
- All children deserve an equal chance at receiving education.

WHY ARE SO MANY CHILDREN NOT RECEIVING THE EDUCATION THEY DESERVE?

- Inadequate **resources** for training teachers
- High **ratio** of students to teachers
- Insufficient **teaching materials** in children's home language
- Children must **drop out** of school to help work and support their families
- **Policies** to support children's school completion are not enforced well
- Girls often have to face the risk of **sexual trafficking, child marriage, and gender-based violence** in schools, which often discourages many from wanting to attain any sort of education





WHAT IS WORLD VISION DOING TO HELP CHILDREN GAIN ACCESS TO EQUAL EDUCATION?

- **Focuses attention** on girls and children with disabilities to develop equitable education for all
- **Forms partnerships** with local organizations, the private sector, governments, and parental involvement
- **Improves community involvement** in education to create stimulating environments for all

HOW DOES EDUCATION LOOK FOR THE DEVELOPING WORLD?

Through the support of World Vision donors around the world...

- **129,318 teachers** empowered to improve the quality of education in 56 countries
- **325,589 parents** and caregivers trained in support of children's learning
- **10.5 million children** benefitted from education programming

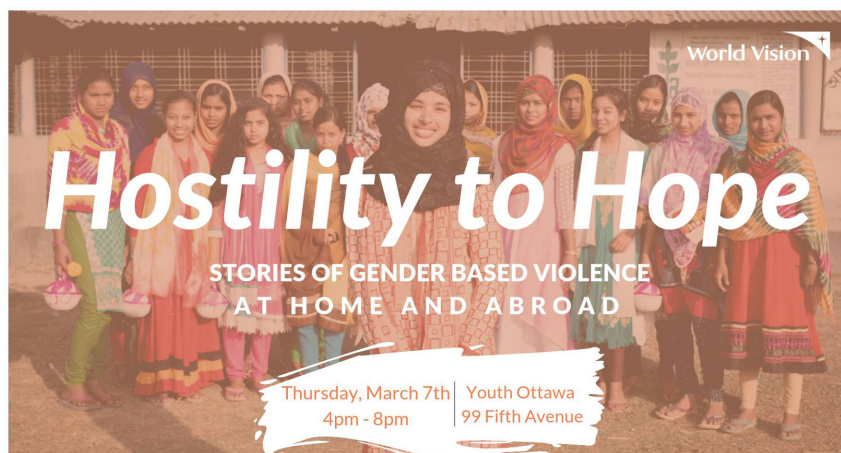
