# A LOOK AT KPAKA-KRIM, SIERRA LEONE

Sierra Leone is a country in West Africa with a population of almost 8 million people. Our club was fortunate enough to be able to sponsor a child in Sierra Leone, specifically in the community of Kpaka-Krim. Here is some information about the community where our sponsor child is from:

- Kpaka-Krim is a one of twelve other chiefdoms located in Pujehun, one of the third largest districts in the country with a population of 12,827 people. Kpaka-Krim is in southern Pujehun.
- The Pujehun district was left in ruin post-civil war (1991-2002) and still visibly carries the wreckage to this day, 16 years later.
- The district population is composed of 19% children under 5 years of age and 28% of children aged between 5 to 14 years old.
- 87% of the population is living within rural areas, with an average family size of 6.2 persons.

# SOCIAL INEQUALITIES IN KPAKA-KRIM

Education quality is lacking due to poor classroom conditions, a shortage of trained teachers, and struggling school management which heavily influences the success rate of the children in Kpaka-Krim. Due to these circumstances, children usually perform poorly on their exams, and 57% of students drop out before their final primary school exams. Child marriages and youth pregnancies also affects these dropout rates, where two thirds of all student dropouts are girls.

Health care is a tricky situation in Kpaka-Krim; children often suffer from malaria, worm infestation, and diarrhea. With health care facilities being out of reach, it is difficult to travel, especially with life-threatening conditions. Properly trained birthing attendants are scarce, often resulting in serious health conditions. Only about 51% of families have access safe water, which is around a 10 km walk from the village.

Child protection remains of key importance as families place greater value on traditional beliefs than formal education, sending their children to religious teachers instead of school. World Vision works in Kpaka-Krim to stress the importance of children's right to education, so that children don't have to marry young or opt out of school to help support their families.



### **ECONOMIC INSUFFICIENCIES**

The rainy season from April to October floods many crops before they can be harvested, which makes it hard to sustain agricultural businesses. Most families end up living on less than \$1 per day. This makes it hard to afford health care and education for children, affecting the wellbeing of the family, as well as the development of the community as a whole.
