

Since the 1970s, World Vision has equipped families with the agricultural techniques to grow and harvest food. It is well understood that for humanitarian work to have a lasting effect in the developing world, it is a matter of providing communities with the tools to be self-sustaining, while World Vision supports them.



World Vision also aims to address the factors that perpetuate poverty. It addresses issues such as child labour and the use of child combatants by endorsing the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
